Fund Commentary


Major equity indexes posted gains in October but not without drama. Market volatility had been rather subdued in the late summer months. In October, however, President Trump threatened to increase tariffs against key partners, which appeared to surprise the markets. Stocks dropped sharply on the 10th of October, with small and mid-cap stocks bearing the brunt of the sell-off. Investors showed bullish sentiment buying on the dip, but not across all areas. The lopsided rebound had large-caps leading the way, primarily in technology, foreign markets and in select financial and energy companies. Basic materials, consumer staples, and retail did not participate in the second half rebound, instead experiencing further declines. In sum, the market continued the theme in October of poor internals as investors showed a high degree of selectivity. Tactical trades within SAPEX focused mostly on larger-cap stocks. Market neutral and long/short funds held within SAPEX benefitted from the diverging market internals.


