### The Spectrum Active Advantage Fund Update

#### **Fund Commentary**

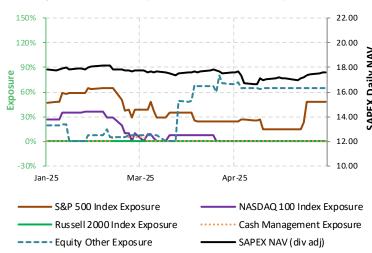
Equities experienced a high degree of volatility in April as President Trump imposed "reciprocal trade tariffs." By mid-month, some of the tariffs were put on hold. These negotiation tactics appeared to have the net effect of causing some investors to lose confidence while others apparently saw opportunity, as evidence by a late month rebound rally. By month's end, equity markets were off their lows though most major indexes were still below key technical levels such as the commonly watched 200-day moving averages. SAPEX entered April positioned with investments traditionally considered defensive with lower beta exposure. Mutual fund investments held use various hedging strategies such as long/short and market neutral. Tactical adjustments were made to a portion of the portfolio that increased exposure moderately as well as beta that included areas such as large-cap growth and large cap technology. While volatility has eased, SAPEX's management is monitoring the late month rally for signs of additional traction or momentum fade.
