

The Spectrum Active Advantage Fund Update

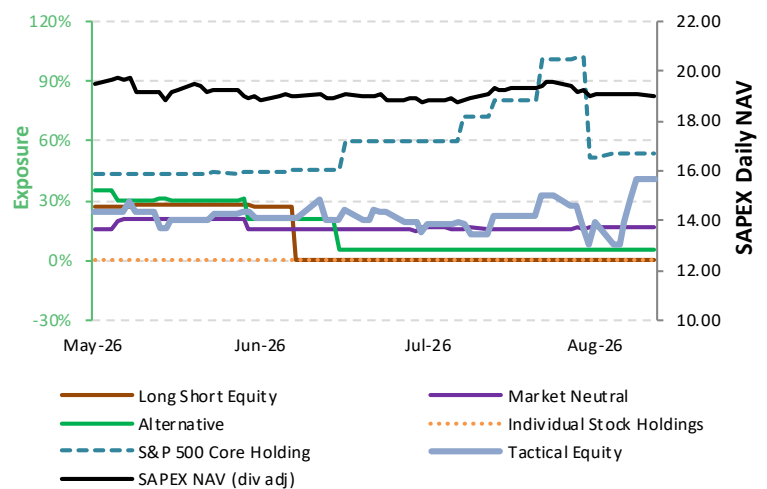
Fund Commentary

U.S. equity markets started the month strong but by mid-month were challenged as investors dealt with rising interest rates, the ongoing conflict with Iran, rising energy prices, inflation concerns, and hesitation heading into and following Fed Chair Warsh's speech in Jackson Hole. In many ways, these factors are interconnected, with the common result of tempering investor sentiment. Small and mid-cap equities tend to be more sensitive to interest rate increases and thus posted greater losses than large-caps. That said, large-cap tech, a large portion of the NASDAQ 100 Index, struggled after key earnings reports. The Spectrum Active Advantage Fund (SAPEX) reflected the changes in momentum, having increased exposure early in the month, though with moderate restraint as internal breadth measures were not fully supportive. Exposure declined soon after mid-month as short-term trend and momentum gave way to pullbacks below important technical signal levels. By the close of the month, equity exposure was primarily focused toward large-cap holdings while maintaining some alternative holdings.

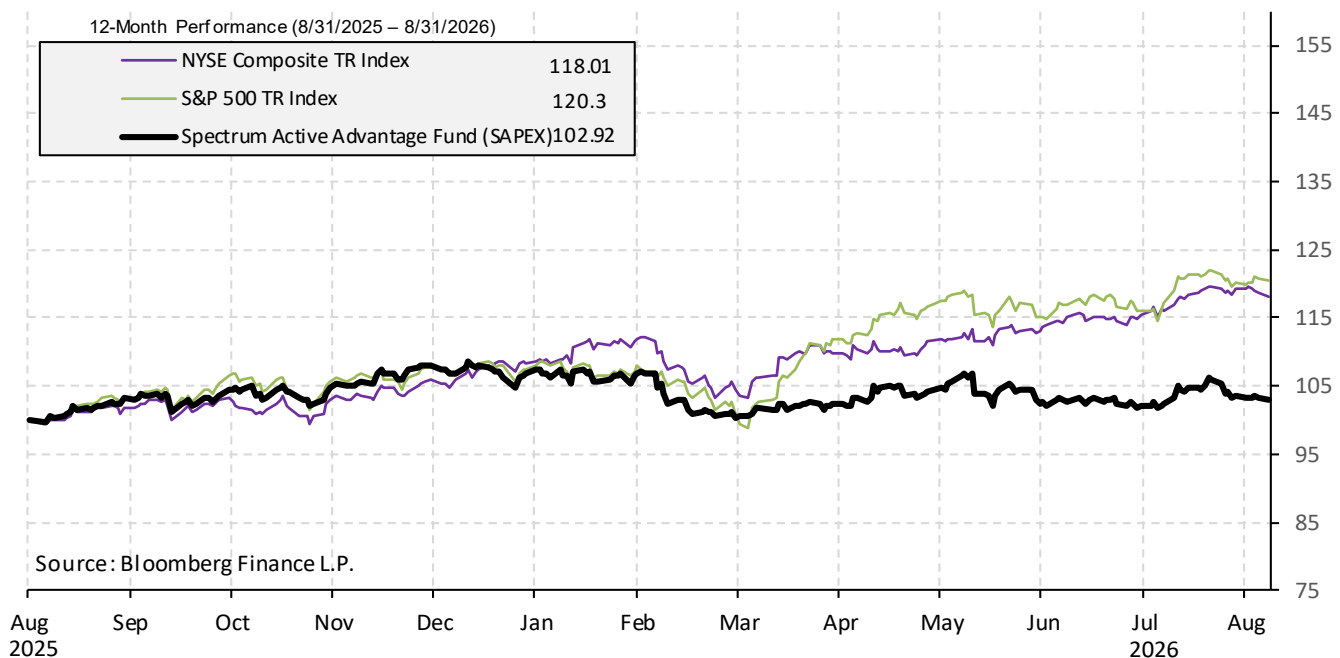
