Fund Commentary

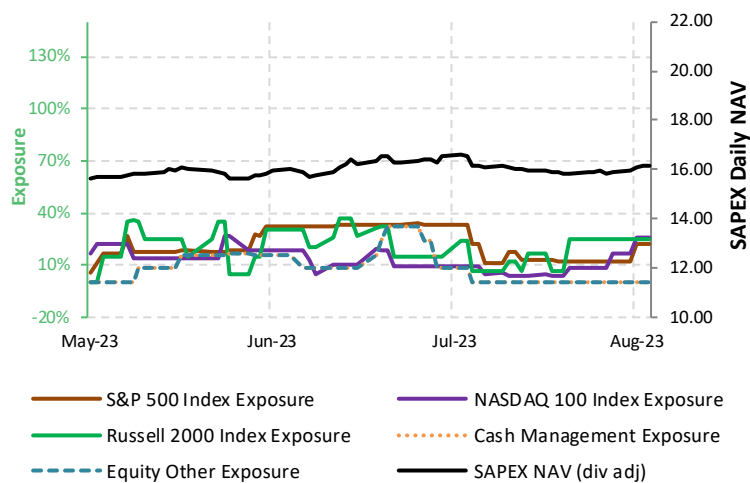
Both prices and market breadth lost momentum in August, however, macro uptrends in the major indexes remained intact. More specifically, the S&P 500 and NASDAQ 100 experienced mild corrections, holding above their rising 200-day moving averages. The Russell 2000 small caps spent a few days under its 200-day moving average though regained positive traction and closed the month back above this commonly watched technical tool. The Spectrum Active Advantage Fund (SAPEX) decreased exposure early in the month in response to weakening breadth and other technical readings. However, concerns were short-lived and equities displayed positive responses to shorter-term oversold levels. In response, SAPEX increased participation in a variety of areas and products including index futures, exchange-traded funds, and individual stocks, all meeting specific technical criteria. Conditions will continue to be monitored for tactical exposure adjustments to the portfolio as needed.

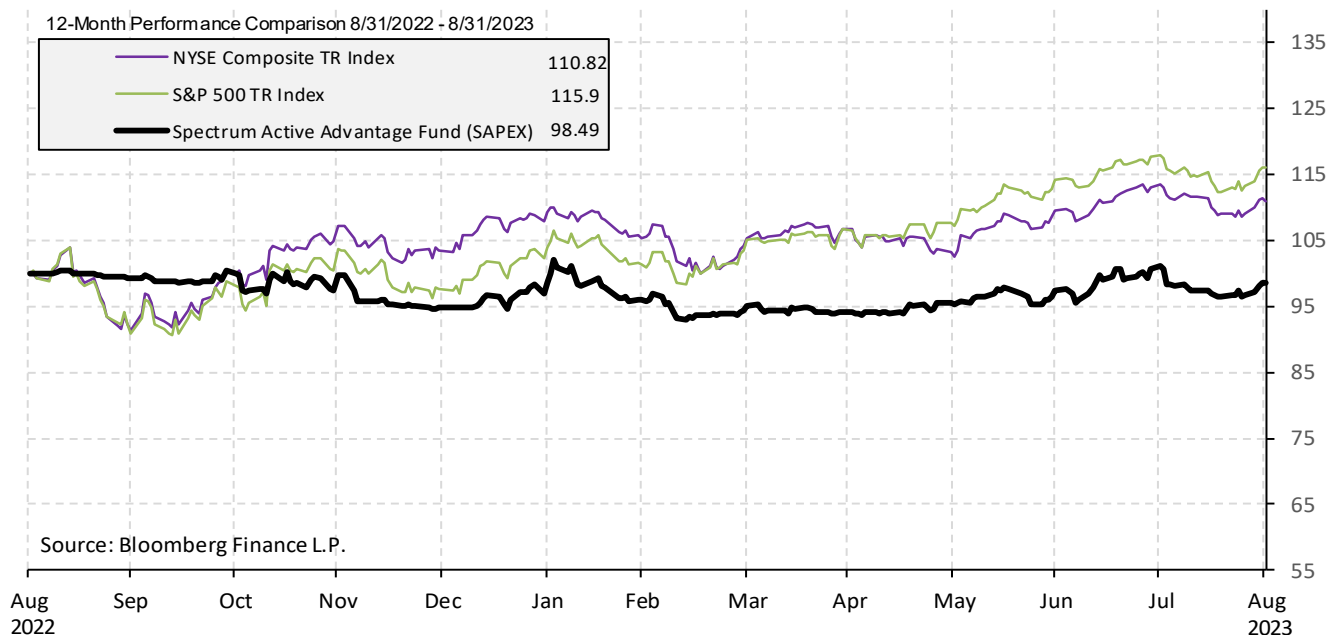
