

The Spectrum Low Volatility Fund Update

Fund Commentary

Economic data in June was generally weaker with enough exceptions to give investors and the Fed reason to question when a lower interest rate cycle may begin. Fed Chairman Powell reiterated the committee is data dependent though investors widely anticipate at least one rate cut this year, down from multiple cuts as believed earlier. Such messaging has kept the bond market in a jagged trading range for the last couple of months though rates did touch a short-term low in June. Most bond classes appear to be in consolidation patterns as economically sensitive groups are generally stalling in overall uptrends. Interest sensitive ones, including treasury bonds, appear to be attempting to improve by way of bases following earlier Q1 2024 downtrends. Spectrum Low Volatility Fund (SVARX) kept trading light in June while trends struggled for traction. Floating rate/bank loan investments were moderated as momentum showed signs of slowing. Municipal bond exposure increased as this group displayed outperformance, building on its uptrend.

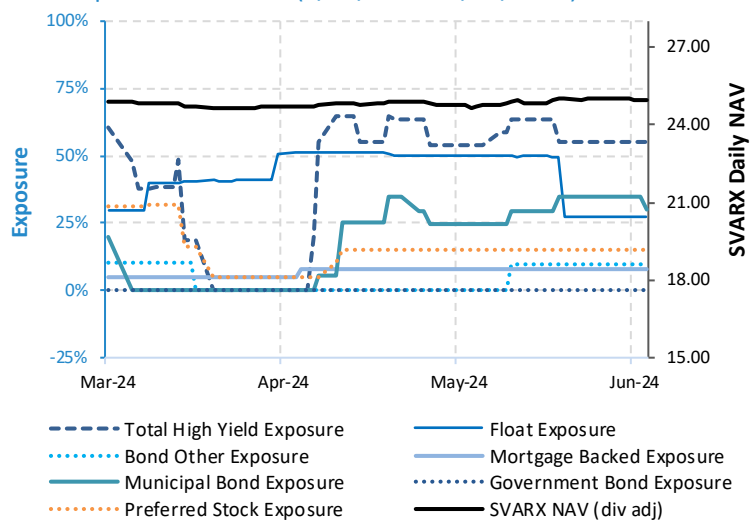

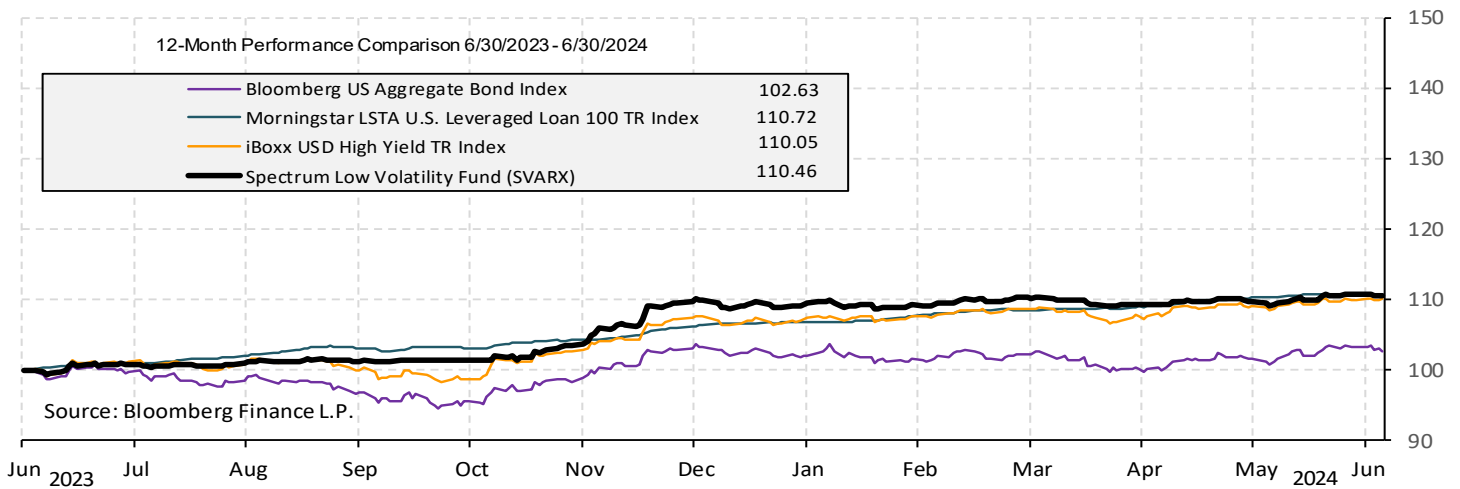

The chart above shows how the Fund performed against related sector indices for the past 12 months. The Fund focuses on domestic fixed income and credit markets, but can invest globally when prudent. The management team navigates the various bond classes and their specific characteristics. Various bond classes tend to move in different directions from each other, as some tend to perform better when there is economic growth while other classes perform better during times of heightened instability. The Fund’s holdings and exposure can shift on a daily basis allowing it to be nimble. Spectrum’s core philosophy is to achieve competitive returns without sacrificing the goal of risk management.
